

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c. Geopolitical analysis

1 Social/cultural/demographic elements

Bangladesh, officially the People's Republic of Bangladesh, shares land borders with India and Myanmar (Burma). Most of the country is dominated by the fertile Ganges-Brahmaputra delta; the northwest and central parts of the country are formed by the Madhupur and the Barind plateaus. Bangladesh is predominately rich fertile flat land. 17% of the country is covered by forests and 12% is covered by hill systems. Bangladesh is the world's eighth most populous country, Bengalis represent 98% of the population.

2. Political context

The Constitution of Bangladesh established a unitary, westminster-style parliamentary republic with universal suffrage. Parliamentary elections are scheduled every five years. In the previous election 2014, Sheikh Hasina won a controversial one-sided walkover election after her main rival Khaleda Zia and all other opposition parties boycotted the polls. The last election in 2018 were not free and fair, were marred by violence and vote rigging; it results a landslide victory for Sheikh Hasina led Awami League, but the opposition leaders rejected the results.

In February 2018 Khaleda Zia was jailed as per court verdict for 5 years. However, she has been released in March'20 amid COVID-19 on humanitarian ground considering her age, 75.

3. Economic elements

Bangladesh, a developing country with a market-based mixed economy, is one of the Next Eleven emerging markets. The financial sector of Bangladesh is the second largest in the Indian subcontinent (After India) and the second-highest foreign-exchange reserves (after India). In the decade since 2004, Bangladesh averaged a GDP growth of 6.5% that of ready-made largely driven bv its exports garments, remittances and the domestic agricultural sector. Bangladesh is a great producer of gas and coal and exports a lot of jute, tea, leather goods, textile, fish and sea food. The pharmaceutical industry meets 97% of domestic demand, and exports to many other countries. Shipbuilding has grown rapidly, with exports to Europe.

The last election in 2018 were not free and fair, were marred by violence and vote rigging; it results a landslide victory for Sheikh Hasina led Awami League, but the opposition leaders rejected the results. Awami League leading the government for three consecutive terms which leads to significance absence of democracy and violation of human rights; impunity for abuses by security forces, including enforced disappearances and extrajudicial killings, remained pervasive. The government continued to violate international standards on freedom of speech in its crackdown on government critic.



However, she has been released in March'20 for six months amid COVID-19 on humanitarian ground considering her age (75); another consecutive six months extension has also been approved.

Summary of HI presence in the country

HI launched its program in Bangladesh in 1997 to advance the long-term rights and social inclusion of people with disabilities. Bangladesh, Nepal and India have developed "community approaches to handicap in development" (CAHD) in partnership with the Centre for Disability in Development (CDD) and the Christoffel Blinden Mission (CBM).

HI Bangladesh 2016-2020 strategic framework aims to contribute to shaping an inclusive society in Bangladesh where people with disabilities and other vulnerable groups fully participate in society, access quality services on an equal basis with others and ultimately benefit from equal opportunities through four pillars: Access to quality education and livelihood services, Access to health and reduction of preventable impairments, Disability right promotion and Disaster risk management.
